First inductee into Dragon Boat Canada's Hall of Fame, awarded at the 2019 Canadian Dragon Boat Championships in Regina. Sue received this recognition for her significant contributions to Dragon Boating in Canada!!



2019 Dragon Boat Canada Hall of Fame

The Story of Sue Humphries, as read at the 2019 Dragon Boat Canada Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony.

"Sue started her paddling career as a founding member of Toronto's BCS crew, Dragons Abreast, little realizing the impact it would have on the next twenty years of her life.


In the early 2000's dragon boating in Canada had developed to the point where it became apparent that the current sport governing body, the Dragon Boat Racing Council of Canada, needed to be re-engineered into an organization that would be representative of paddlers and coaches nationwide. In the Spring of 2002, Sue, Adrian Lee and Wendy Perkins

organized and convened a weekend conference which served as the first general meeting ofwhat would become Dragon Boat Canada. Sue served as volunteer Secretariat to the Board for three years and then was elected the first President. She served in that capacity for one year and another eight years as a member of the Board. She currently serves as a member of the High Performance Committee.

In 2005, working with Ellen Law of the United States and Mike Haslam from the IDBF, Sue played an instrumental role in convincing the IDBF to introduce the Sr B racing class at IDBF Championships. Sr C was added in 2013.

Sue is the co-editor, with fellow paddler and Librarian, Arlene Chan of Paddles Up, Dragon Boat Racing in Canada, the only book in English

As a paddler, Sue has been proud to represent Canada at the IDBF WRCCs, racing in Sr A, Sr B, and Sr C. In 2018, she competed in the IVF World Outrigger Sprints, where she and her fellow crew members set a world record in Masters 70 Women OC-6."
