### Job Description

The SNCC Developing Coach positions will be responsible for sport instruction, keeping attendance and skills tracking digitally, in person and electronic communication with athletes and parents, posting on social media and executing program plans approved by the SNCC Head Coach for the following programs at South Niagara Canoe Club: (1) Paracanoe, supporting introduction of persons with disabilities to flatwater kayaking, (2) Masters Kayak, leading adults and older adults to participate in flatwater kayaking, and (3) Youth Canoe/Kayak U12/U16, introducing flatwater canoe and kayak to youth ages 10-15, (4) Outrigger Canoe, leading adults, older adults and para athletes to participate in flatwater outrigger canoe, and (5) Canoe Kids Summer Camp, which consists of instruction in safe practices around water, learning about paddling equipment, as well as practice & fun time "on the water" in kayaks, canoes, and dragon boats, as well as dry land games and activities for youth ages 8-13. The SNCC Developing Coaches interact with a wide variety of individuals spanning youth, adult, and seniors, as well as persons with disabilities and special needs, both seasoned athletes and beginners to the sports of canoe, kayak, outrigger, and dragon boat. The SNCC Developing Coaches will serve an additional function of providing regatta/competition support for the recreational and competitive aspects of the club at the Welland International Flatwater Centre (same location as their place of work), including organization of equipment and volunteers to ensure readiness for both fun and competitive competition situations. The SNCC Developing Coaches will report to the SNCC Head Coach, and/or SNCC High Performance Coach.

- Experience working or volunteering at a non-profit sport club
